

## 2010 Arizona State Dressage Championship Rules

The 2010 Arizona State Dressage Championship Rules and Nomination Form appear in the Arizona Dressage Omnibus or ADA and TDC websites. Updates will be posted on these websites, if required: ADA, [www.azdressage.org](http://www.azdressage.org); TDC, [www.tucsondressageclub.org](http://www.tucsondressageclub.org).

### NOMINATION

Horses must be nominated to be eligible for participation in the Arizona State Championships. The nominating fee and form must be received before any scores will count toward qualification. The nominating fee is \$25 per horse. Since only one horse/rider combination can compete at State Championships, the fee goes toward the horse. The horse may be ridden by multiple riders during the show year. Qualifying scores must be earned by the horse/rider combination, even though the nomination fee is paid on the horse. If multiple riders qualify on the same horse, **one rider only** may compete in the State Championship classes and the concurrent Fall Fiesta show. See State Championship Rule 5.

### QUALIFYING

Open to any Arizona resident, including student resident (U.S. citizenship not required). **Rider must be a member of an Arizona GMO (GMO = Group Member Organization of USDF – United States Dressage Federation) by August 31, 2010 to ride in 2010 State Championship show classes.** Rider need not be a member of an Arizona GMO at the time the qualifying scores are earned.

Competition year for the 2010 State Championships qualifying is from October 1, 2009 through September 30, 2010. The Championship Classes will be held November 6-7, 2010. The Arizona State Dressage Championship Show is held in conjunction with the ADA Fall Fiesta Show 2010. Horse/rider combinations must earn two (2) qualifying scores under two (2) different judges at US Equestrian Federation recognized shows held in Arizona between October 1, 2009 and September 30, 2010 in any test of the level.

Horse/rider combination may move up a level during the qualifying year. Horse/rider combination may compete at only two consecutive levels in the Championship Classes or the Fall Fiesta Show held in conjunction with the Championships; only one horse/rider combination per division per level.

Horse/rider combination must declare Rider's status (Open, Adult Amateur or Junior/Young Rider) and must provide proof of eligibility to show management.

### COMPETITION

Qualifying competitions must be recognized by at least US Equestrian Federation.

Qualified horse/riders/level will be published in the TDC [Transitions](#) and the ADA [Centerline](#) and on the TDC website ([tucsondressageclub.org](http://tucsondressageclub.org)) and the ADA website, ([azdressage.org](http://azdressage.org)). Copies of the list of qualifiers will be sent to all Arizona GMO's. Any rider who does not appear on the qualifying list (and who believes that s/he has indeed qualified) must supply a photocopy of the face of both qualifying test sheet rides OR copies of USDF records of qualifying rides to the show secretary upon entering Arizona State Dressage Championship classes.

1. Championship Classes will be double judged.
2. THE HIGHEST TEST OF THE LEVEL WILL BE RIDDEN FROM MEMORY.
3. NO WHIPS MAY BE CARRIED IN CHAMPIONSHIP CLASSES.
4. Cross entering divisions is not permitted unless at levels that do not offer separate divisions.
5. **At no time during the Championship or Fall Fiesta Show competition may any horse entered in the Championship competition be ridden by anyone other than the rider entered in the Championship competition on that horse (Exception: grooms riding on loose rein). Further, any horse entered in the Championship competition, even if entered at two levels, must be ridden by the same rider throughout all days of the competition, including the Fall Fiesta Show held in conjunction with the Championships show.**
6. Championship Classes will follow US Equestrian Federation and FEI rules regarding attire and equipment allowed. Ring stewards will check saddlery and inspect bits of each horse immediately after it has completed its test and has left the area. Any discrepancy to the saddlery or equipment rules will entail immediate elimination (See DR121.8).
7. A horse/rider combination, having won the Championship at a particular level may not compete at that level or lower, other than Grand Prix, in future years.

## COMPETITION (CONT'D)

8. In the event of a tie (equality of total points) for Champion and/or Reserve Champion in Championship classes, the collective marks will determine first, second and/or third places (i.e., when a tie for first place is broken by collective marks, tied competitors will receive first and second places, etc.) If collective marks are equal, the tie will remain unbroken (i.e., two first places will be awarded, next third place, etc.) This policy for breaking ties will also apply to subsequent placing in the class. In the case of a tie (equality of total points and collective marks) for Champion, prize money, (if offered) for Champion and Reserve Champion will be combined and divided equally between the competitors. See USEF Rules DR123.3 and DR123.6.

## AWARDS

- ❖ Award and ribbon to Champion. Reserve Champion ribbon and ribbons 3<sup>rd</sup> through 6<sup>th</sup> place in each Championship class.
- ❖ Scores from Championship classes do not count towards open show high points or any ADA or TDC Year End Awards.

## STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS AWARDS CEREMONIES

- ❖ Riders placing in State Championships classes must be present, mounted and in full riding attire for award ceremonies.
- ❖ Horse leg wraps may be white or black.
- ❖ Competitors may decline to participate in the victory round.
- ❖ Failure, without prior permission of the competition manager, to be present and properly attired will eliminate the official score and placing, and the next highest score will move up.
- ❖ If Awards Ceremonies are scheduled in conflict with a competitor's/horse's preparation or scheduled ride, the competitor and/or horse will be excused from the Awards Ceremony. Management will attempt to allow the rider and/or horse to be recognized at a subsequent Awards Ceremony at that show, if requested.
- ❖ The tentative schedule and procedure for the Awards Ceremony schedule will be posted in the show secretary's office by noon on the day prior to the start of the competition.
