- Entry Procedures:** For each horse/rider combination entered, please send your completed entry form and all fees to the show secretary. Make checks payable to ADA. Entries must be **received** by 6 pm on the closing date.
- Incorrect or Incomplete Entry:** A fee of up to \$25 for any entry without all required copies of current membership cards and signatures included with entry. USEF changes fees often. Double check before sending your entry.
- Class Schedule:** See the Arizona Dressage Omnibus, www.azdressage.org, or current ADA Centerline Newsletter.
- Class Fees:** FEI \$60, Junior (18 and under) \$40, All Others \$50. Great American/USDF qualifier classes add \$10.
- ADA Futurity:** Classes 1111 and 1133. Jungle Park Risinger Perpetual Trophy. \$300 purse added by ADA for Open division; \$300 purse for AA/Jr/YR division. See Futurity rules.
- ADA Prize Money Classes:** See Awards section and Class List. Refer to ADA 2008 Prize Money Program.
- Stakes Classes (Sunday only):** Open, AA and Jr/YR Divisions. Add \$10 to entry fee. Prize money for each division will be determined by the number of stakes entries. Winner take all. Refer to the Awards section for the policy on ties involving prize money. Checks for prize money will be mailed to riders within 30 days after the show.
- Dover Medal Class:** Class 123 – Second Level Test 3. See Standard Show Rules.
- Office Fee:** \$30. Non-refundable. **Refunds:** No refunds (including stabling) for any reason after the closing date, including cancellation of a class or classes, or all or part of the competition due to severe weather, accident or any other emergency.
- Late/Post Entries:** Accepted as space allows. Add \$30 per entry.
- Changes:** \$10 per change, if allowed. Bring \$10 to the show office when you request the change.
- Not Competing (Schooling) Horses:** Must pay a \$20.00 schooling fee, office fee, plus stabling or trailer in fee.
- Leadline Demonstration:** To be held during Saturday lunch break, location to be announced. Treat as a Not Competing Horse. For riders eight and under. Questions, call Show Manager.
- Stabling:** \$135 for Thursday (check in after 12:00 noon Thursday) through Sunday, \$100 for Friday (check in after 7:00 am) through Sunday (check out by 6:00 pm), 2 bags bedding included. Inform the show secretary of stabling requirements when submitting entries. All horses on site over night must be stabled. The ADA contract with WestWorld specifies that shavings be purchased from their on-site vendor, Performance Feed & Bedding. Contact them at 480 563 7743 for additional shavings.
- Stables:** Permanent 10 x 12 stalls with doors. Shavings only, no straw or outside shavings allowed on the grounds. No smoking allowed in stall areas.
- Day Stall:** (6 am-6 pm) \$50. One bag bedding provided.
- Trailer-in/day:** \$30 (do not pay if you've paid for stabling or a day stall)
- Scratches:** Exhibitors have the responsibility of informing the show office of their intention to scratch. Scratches before the closing date may be made for any reason and all fees will be refunded except the office fee.
- Ride Times:** Preliminary ride times and a show schedule will be available on ADA's website, www.azdressage.org. Final ride times will be posted at the show by noon, Friday. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to verify final ride times at the show. Please notify the show secretary of any scheduling conflicts. Ride times will be mailed only if you include a #10 SASE.
- Numbers:** Three numbers will be provided for each horse. It is strongly suggested by show management that a number be placed on each side of the horse—bridle, saddle pad, or rider's boots. The third number is for the halter. All horses on the show grounds must have on a number while out of their stalls.
- Arenas:** Footing in competition and warm-up arenas is a sand/dirt mixture. All tests will be ridden in 20 x 60m arenas. Some competition arenas may be open for schooling on Thursday and Friday, but priority will be given to ring set-up and maintenance. During the show, competition arenas will be open to hand walking only up to one half hour prior to the first class and after the end of competition on Saturday and Sunday.

Awards: First Place-Prize and Ribbon for Open, AA and Jr/YR Divisions. Divisions with 3 or fewer entries may be combined for awarding ribbons. Ribbons awarded through 6th place. Test of Choice class placing will be determined by division within each class regardless of which test is ridden. Ties will not be broken. Ties in classes which involve prize money shall remain tied for the purpose of dividing prize money.

The amount of prize money is determined in part by the number of class entries. A portion of each class fee is designated for the prize money pool. A score of 55% or better must be achieved to be eligible for prize money.

Prize money awarded, first through third places (50%-30%-20%) in Open, AA, and Jr/YR Divisions for the following classes: 204, 214, 224, 233, 243; combined FEI classes 251, and 252; and combined FEI classes 253, 254, 255. Prize money awarded (50%-30%-20%) for the first through third highest scores for combined Freestyle classes 266, 267, regardless of division or level ridden. Checks for prize money will be sent within 30 days of the show to the owner or lessee of record.

Golf Cart Rental: Friday through Sunday Rental. 2 Passenger \$150, 4 Passenger or utility wagon \$180. To ensure availability, contact Show Manager by March 25. Cancellation of golf cart reservations accepted until March 26 when we finalize the number of carts to be delivered to the show. **Operation of Motorized Vehicles: USEF GR301.5.** Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles on the competition grounds of recognized competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s) and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individuals in accordance with Rule 7. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

Spring Celebration Perpetual Trophies

Perpetual Trophies: High Point champion for all levels, Training through FEI. Single highest score to count. Open and Amateur riders are eligible to compete for these awards (donated by Equus Dressage and Mari Moon): Junior High Point Perpetual trophies, Training through Fourth level. Owners and riders must be current ADA members for all perpetual trophies.

ADA Newcomer's Perpetual Trophy: Awarded to the horse that is new to dressage in the current show year beginning October 1, 2007, receiving the highest percentage score in any one test at Training Level. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to indicate in the Spring Show entry form and to the Show Secretary that he/she is eligible and would like to compete for the trophy. Trophy donated by ADA and awarded at the Spring Show.

Serendipity: Highest score at first level Futurity scores not to count. Donated by Nancy Miller.

Mulcheck Memorial Perpetual Trophy: Highest score at second level. Donated by Nancy Brannon.

ADA President's Cup Perpetual Trophy: Highest score at third level or above.

Dr. Rolf Vlatten Perpetual Trophy: Highest score at third level. Donated by Shirley Rector and Kim Yacobucci.

To-The-Max Perpetual Trophy: Highest score at fourth level. Donated by Kay Lorenzen.

CARA FEI Challenge Perpetual Trophy: Highest score at PSG or above. Freestyles and YR selection trials not eligible. Donated by Central Arizona Riding Academy.

Endless Summer Perpetual Trophy: Highest score by Junior/YR at training or first level. Donated by Jennifer Cannerelli.

Squirrel Perpetual Trophy: Highest score by a Junior, 10 yrs or less, at any level.

Musical Freestyle Perpetual Trophy: Highest scoring musical freestyle of the show. Donated by Mari Moon and Equus Dressage.

High Point Quarterhorse: Sponsored by Rocking Horse Ranch. Eligibility – must be a registered Quarterhorse with AQHA. Exhibitors are to indicate on the Spring Show entry form and to the Show Secretary that the horse is eligible and competing for the trophy. Only horses shown by a junior or amateur are eligible. The highest individual score at Training, First and Second Level will determine the winner.

Perpetual High Point Trophies for Adult Amateurs: Donated by Maryse Shank. Single highest score to count, Training Level through FEI. Owner and rider must be current ADA members to be eligible. Training through Fourth Level are polished pewter plates. FEI is a wooden horse head statue.

Spring Celebration Special Awards

Young Equestrian Achievement Award: Highest score at second level or above in Open or Junior/YR classes, by a rider who has not reached 21st birthday as of January 1 of current year. Donated by Barbara Stine.

ADA Futurity: Jungle Park Risinger Perpetual Trophy. \$300 purse added by ADA for Open division; \$300 purse for AA/Jr/YR division. See Futurity rules.

Royal Salute Trophy: Copy of Arabian or Half-Arabian horse registration must be on file. Winner is horse with highest average of two scores at first level or above. One must be earned at the ADA Fall show and one at the ADA Spring show. Awarded at the Spring Show.

ATTENTION COMPETITORS

Each competitor is responsible for supplying management with correct association numbers (USDF, USEF) for horse, owner, rider, and trainer, before the day(s) of the competition.

The scores of competitors who fail to supply correct numbers may not be counted toward national awards.

STANDARD SHOW RULES

Management may deny entry to any competitor if the competitor has outstanding debt to the sponsoring organization.

1) DEFINITIONS:

ENTRY: Each horse/rider combination is a unique entry and will be assigned a number.

JUNIOR/YOUNG RIDER CLASSES: An individual is eligible to compete as a Young Rider (YR) from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 16 until the end of the calendar year in which he/she reaches the age of 21, and as a Junior (Jr) if they have not reached their 18th birthday by December 1 of the current competition year.

ADULT/AMATEUR CLASSES: An individual is eligible to compete as an Adult/ Amateur from the beginning of the calendar year in which he/she reaches the age of 22 and has a current USEF Amateur Card, or pay a non-member amateur fee at the competition.

DRESSAGE EQUITATION CLASSES: To be conducted in accordance with USEF Rule DR132.1.

MUSICAL FREESTYLE: The rider is to create and execute, from memory, an original ride which shows the horse to its best advantage. Creativity and artistic presentation as well as technical execution will be considered. Riders must supply their own music, in cassette or CD form, to the show secretary at least 2 hours before the class begins. (Bring two copies) (See USEF or USDF rules for specific rules and current time restrictions) Ridden in a standard arena. See #7 under USEF Rules for eligibility requirements.

COACH: Adult or adults who receive remuneration for having or sharing the responsibility for instructing, teaching, schooling, or advising a rider in equestrian skills.

TRAINER: Any adult (cannot be a minor) who has the responsibility for the care, training, custody or performance of a horse while on the show grounds.

USDF QUADRILLE: A team of four riders. Arena: 20 x 40 meters. Music optional. Matching bandages are permitted. Riding coats are optional. You may wear matching polo shirts, etc. Boots and hats are required. Score sheets and guidelines are available from the USDF office. Please specify level and team on entry form.

OPENING DATE: The earliest date Competition Management will accept an Entry into its Show. Entries received before the Opening Date may be returned.

CLOSING DATE: The last date Competition Management will accept an Entry into its show. The show may refuse Entries before the Closing Date if it fills the show. The Show may accept Entries for some period after the Closing Date but may charge a late fee.

2) ENTRIES: All horses brought on the show ground must complete an entry form and be issued a number. ENTRIES must be POSTMARKED or RECEIVED by the CLOSING DATE to be accepted (check individual show). Entries must be filled out in their entirety. Management reserves the right to charge a fee up to \$25 or return entries which are incomplete or inaccurate. Entries in Junior/Young Rider and Adult/Amateur Classes, if offered, must meet the definition. Adult Amateur entries must include proof of a current USEF Amateur Card with the entry. If the entry form does not designate a Junior/Young Rider or Adult Amateur status or, in the case of Adult Amateur, if the entry does not show proof of a current USEF Amateur Card the rider will be entered in the Open Class. Entry preference may be given to competitors at 3rd Level and above. Each class will be filled on a first-come first-served basis. If classes are oversubscribed, a WAITING LIST will be maintained. NO PHONE entries, however some shows may allow FAXED ENTRIES.

INCOMPLETE OR INACCURATE ENTRIES: Copies of all registrations and membership cards must be provided with each entry. If copies are not provided, show secretaries may search online and/or make copies after signatures. All signatures must be present. Competitors may be assessed a fee up to \$25 for missing signatures or information. Bridle numbers will not be awarded until this fee is paid.

After the Closing Date, changes in a horse or rider will be considered a cancellation of the entry. If the Show is filled with a waiting list, the new entry will go to the bottom of the waiting list. Any post entry fees will apply.

POST ENTRIES will be allowed on a space-available, first-come-first-served basis. No entries will be allowed after a class has begun. Applicable show fees will apply.

3) OFFICIAL RIDE TIMES: It is the rider's responsibility to inform the Management of any time conflicts at least 24 hours before the scheduled ride. A move can sometimes be made if there is a scratched time slot opening. Classes may be scheduled out of order. It is the competitor's responsibility to find out his/her official ride time. Failure to enter the arena at the specified time will result in elimination.

Show management will make every attempt to offer riders competing in more than one class or on multiple horses at least 50 minutes between ride start times but reserves the right to shorten this time if necessary. By signing the entry, riders have agreed to this and this signature constitutes written consent specified in USEF DR126.3.

4) SCRATCHES: Competitors who do not inform the show office of a class scratch are considered "No Show." Management may consider any "No Show" scratched for the balance of the day and rides may be assigned to other competitors.

5) CONDUCT OF SHOW: Show Management reserves the right to limit entries, add or divide classes, to add or substitute judges, to cancel awards and prizes and/or make whatever changes are required by circumstances to the competition specifications listed herein. Show Management reserves the right to refuse entries in accordance with USEF Rule GR1509. Management reserves the right to limit the number of times per day a rider may show and/or the number of times per day a horse/rider combination may show. Management reserves the right to move a ride from the test of choice class if that test is being offered that day in another class. Divisions will be pinned separately. Divisions with 3 or fewer entries may be combined for awarding ribbons.

6) FEES: The following fees apply to every Participating Competition.

USEF Fee \$12.00 (\$7 D/M + \$5 fee)

USEF Non-member Fee \$20.00

USEF Breed/Discipline Fee \$5.00 (Senior only. Juniors are exempt from this fee)

USEF Affidavit Fee \$5.00

USDF Non-member Fee \$20.00

USDF/GAIG Qualifying Fee \$10.00

USDF Affidavit Fee \$5.00

6.A): USDF NON-MEMBERS: Effective 10/1/2007: For each USDF non-member (NM) owner/lessee, and USDF non-member rider there will be a USDF non-member fee of \$20 per competition. An individual with a USDF NM identification number is not eligible for any USDF membership benefits. Competitors can apply for a USDF NM identification number online or at the competition. Once a USDF NM number has been assigned, a USDF NM card can be obtained from the USDF Web site. *Exception: Riders and owners/lessees competing only in classes which are exempt from the USDF HID requirements are also exempt from the USDF non-member ID requirements. Some exempt classes include USDF Introductory Level, Pas de Deux, Quadrille classes; FEI ParaEquestrian classes; or leadline exhibitions, walk-trot and academy classes.*

7) SCORES: It is the Competitor's responsibility to verify the accuracy of all scores. Scoring errors must be reported to the Show Secretary within one hour of the official posting of the scores from the last class of that competition day.

8) TESTS: The current USEF and FEI Tests. All USDF Tests offered will be 2007 or most current version. Scored tests will be given only to riders or their agents and only after the results are finalized and the class is placed.

9) TEST OF CHOICE: Show management may move a rider from a test of choice class to a scheduled class if that level test is offered that day. Test of Choice class placing will be determined by division within each class regardless of which test is ridden.

10) SADDLERY: Saddlery will be checked in accordance with Rule DR121.8 and at the discretion of the Technical Delegate. **Horses must have a number on at all times except while in a stall. If three numbers are provided, it is strongly recommended by show management that horses wear two numbers (on each side of the bridle, saddle pad or each rider boot) while being ridden. The additional number is for the halter.**

11) PRIZE MONEY: Prize money for other than Stakes classes will be mailed to the owner or lessee of record within 30 days of the show. See individual Prize Lists for Stakes and/or class prize money policy.

12) MINOR EXHIBITORS: Parents or guardians of minor exhibitors shall hold the Competition Management harmless for injury to such minor. No minor's entry will be accepted unless it is signed by a parent or guardian. The signature of instructors, agent or other unrelated persons will not be acceptable.

13) RETURNED CHECKS: Checks returned by the bank will be handled according to the following procedure: A 10% penalty (minimum \$25.00) will be assessed for each returned check.

14) JUDGES: It is the purpose of the management to run the horse show at the highest possible level of sportsmanship. The management used the utmost care to select judges with broad experience and knowledge. The judges' decisions in the show ring are their own responsibility and management accepts no responsibility for those decisions

15) PROTESTS: Any exhibitor lodging a protest must first deposit \$200.00 with the secretary of the show, which sum will be forfeited to the Horse Show if not sustained. All protests must be filed in writing, signed by the protester, and filed with the Show Secretary within 48 hours of the occurrence of the alleged violation. See USEF Rule GR603 for more information about protests by non-members.

16) LUNGEING: Lungeing is not allowed in the competition and warm-up arenas. Use designated lungeing areas only.

17) USDF/USEF CHAMPIONSHIP CLASSES: Qualifying classes are open ONLY to horses that have been lifetime recorded with the USDF and USEF, ridden and owned by Junior, Senior, Affiliate or Life Members of USEF and Participating or Life Members of USDF. Copies of all Membership Cards must accompany entry.

18) STALLIONS: All stallions must be attended or stabled at all times.

19) TECHNICAL DELEGATE: The technical delegate is available at all times for clarification of rules or to answer any questions and can arrange an appointment with a judge. Any exhibitor attempting to interfere with the judges in any way, or who by act influence shall be guilty of conduct unbecoming an exhibitor, shall forfeit all paid fees and be excluded from further competitions. No one shall approach a judge regarding a decision unless first obtaining the permission of the technical delegate.

20) DIVISIONS: O=Open, A=Adult Amateur, J=Junior, Y=Young Rider, Q=GAIG/USDF Qualifying. Please refer to the Standard Show Rules Definitions section for further clarification of the Junior and Young Rider Divisions.

21) COACHES: Coaches must sign USEF entry blanks. Coaches must also stand outside the warm up area while warming up riders, for safety reasons.

22) FACILITIES: Facilities are multi-use and show management is not responsible for, nor in control of, other activities at the facility.

23) DOVER MEDAL CLASS: To be eligible, a rider must meet the following criteria: 1. Rider must be a current USDF group, participating, or intercollegiate/interscholastic member as of the show date. 2. Rider must be showing at Second Level. 3. Rider must be an amateur in accordance with Article GR808 of the USEF rules and be registered with USEF as an adult amateur as of the show date. The eligible rider with the highest score of 58% or better in Class 123 will receive the Dover medal and neck ribbon. Winners will receive a \$20 Dover Saddlery Gift Certificate for each of the first three USDF/Dover Adult Medals they win during the 2008 competition season. Riders who win three USDF/Dover Adult Amateur medals in the same competition year will receive the USDF/Dover National Merit Award. All riders who qualify for a USDF/Dover National Merit award will be eligible to compete for the USDF/Dover Adult Medal National Championship. For more information about the Dover Program, visit ww.usdf.org.

DISEASE OUTBREAK RULE

In the face of a disease outbreak, the show committee reserves the right to follow the AVMA (American Veterinary Medicine Association) and or the AAEP (American Association of Equine Practitioners) recommendations as to what testing would be necessary to consider a horse free from the disease in question. They also reserve the right to require written proof that said testing has been performed within the recommended period of time. If the competitor does not adhere to the requirements the show committee can refuse entrance to the show.

Some diseases are "Reportable Diseases", meaning they must be reported to the State of Arizona Department of Agriculture. These diseases are subject to quarantine rules of the state. An example of one such disease is Vesicular Stomatitis. In the case of reportable diseases a health certificate is required from an accredited veterinarian with proper statement regarding said disease to accompany the horse.

Since this rule could apply to any number of diseases, and it would be impossible to list them all here, the show committee will post the testing/health certificate requirements on the sponsor web page if there is a current disease outbreak in the area.

USEF RULES

USEF Rules apply to Licensed Competitions. The following is only a small portion of the rules. If you are entering a recognized Competition, you are responsible for understanding all pertinent rules. **Contact THE FEDERATION at (859) 258-2472 if you need a Rulebook.**

1) Every class offered herein which is covered by the rules and specifications of the current USEF or FEI Rules will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith. It is the responsibility of the competitor to be familiar with these rules.

Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Preliminary Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides provided the respective breed/discipline dues or breed/discipline category fee has been paid. A nonmember may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a \$20 nonmember registration fee and a \$5 breed/discipline category fee for each breed/discipline. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions; 8) Opportunity classes. 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

2) PROOF OF MEMBERSHIP - SEE SHOW RULES ON REQUIRED ENTRY PROOF OF REGISTRATIONS/ MEMBERSHIPS

2.A) USEF MEMBERS: Proof of USEF Membership for owner, handler, trainer, rider and coach plus horse registration, if applicable, must accompany entry. The USEF card must be available during the show for inspection by the Show Secretary. In the event a member does not have proof of USEF membership, he/she must sign an affidavit and pay a \$5.00 fee. If an individual who is not a member fills out an affidavit, he/she will be assessed a fine of \$200.00 by USEF. If the owner, trainer, rider USEF member does not have the dressage discipline designation on his/her USEF card, he/she must pay an additional \$5.00 DRESSAGE DISCIPLINE FEE.

2.B.) USEF NON-MEMBERS: If the owner, trainer, rider is not an USEF member, he must pay the \$20.00 USEF NON-MEMBER fee. Seniors only must also pay a \$5.00 DRESSAGE DISCIPLINE FEE for a total of \$25.00 for each non-member. Juniors must pay only the \$20.00 non-member fee. They are exempt from the \$5.00 Discipline Fee.

2.C) Riders in Adult Amateur Classes, if offered, must be at least 21 years old and hold a current USEF Amateur Card, proof of which must accompany entry. USEF non-members may purchase an Amateur Card for \$30.00.

3) Each competitor is responsible for supplying management with correct association numbers. (USDF, USEF) for horse, owner, rider, and trainer before the day(s) of competition. The scores of competitors who fail to supply correct numbers may not count toward national awards.

4) VETERINARIAN: A Veterinarian will be on call. His/Her name, address and phone number will be posted at the Show Office no later than the day before the show.

5) FIRST-AID: A first aid provider will be present on the grounds.

6) CONCESSIONS: Food concession will be available on the show grounds during the performances of the show.

7) FREESTYLE: USEF DR128.9. Except for USEF/USDF Championship classes and for FEI Pony Riders, FEI Junior and Young Rider Freestyles, in order to enter a freestyle class at any level, a horse/rider combination must have received a minimum score of 58% in the highest test of the declared freestyle level or any test of a higher level at a Federation Recognized Competition. A photocopy of the test verifying eligibility must be submitted with the entry for a freestyle class.

8) By entering a Federation-licensed Competition and signing this entry blank as the Owner, Lessee, Trainer, Manager, Agent, Coach, Driver, Rider, Handler, Vaultor, or Longeur and on behalf of myself and my principals, representatives, employees and agents, I agree that I am subject to the Bylaws and Rules of United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. ("the Federation") and the local rules of the competition. I agree to be bound by the Bylaws and Rules of the Federation and of the competition. I will accept as final decision of the Hearing Committee on any question arising under the Rules, and agree to release and hold harmless the competition, the Federation, their officials, directors and employees for any action taken under the Rules. I represent that I am eligible to enter and/or participate under the Rules, and every horse I am entering is eligible as entered. I also agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, the Federation and/or the competition may use or assign photographs, videos, audios, cablecasts, or other likenesses of me and my horse taken during the course of the competition for the promotion, coverage or benefit of the competition, sport, or the Federation. Those likenesses shall not be used to advertise a product or they may not be used in such a way as to jeopardize amateur status. I hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any right in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation, invasion or privacy, right of publicity, or to misappropriation. The construction and application of Federation Rules are governed by the laws of the State of New York, and any action instituted against the Federation must be filed in New York State. See GR 1502.5.

9) Disposal of needles or other sharp disposable instruments: In accordance with GR 1211.5, competition management shall place a minimum of one sharps container per each competition, whether or not stabling is provided. Additionally, at least one sharps container per fifty occupied stalls for the disposal of needles and other disposable sharp instruments in convenient locations in barns housing show horses. It is the competition management's responsibility to replace such containers when full and dispose of them properly. Competition management may fine any individuals, including trainers, owners, exhibitors, or their agents, up to \$100.00 for improper disposal of needles or other sharp disposable instruments.

10) Operation of Motorized Vehicles: USEF GR301.5. Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles on the competition grounds of recognized competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s) and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individuals in accordance with Rule 7. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

11) Pets: USEF GR301.6: Dogs are not permitted to be loose on competition grounds and must be on a leash or otherwise contained. Individuals must not lead dogs on a leash while mounted. Dog owners failing to comply with this rule may be subject to penalty under Chapters 6 and 7, as well as issuance of warning cards. Effective 1/16/06.
